**THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM** - Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays after the 11:00 am Mass. Parents must be registered in the Parish and have attended a Baptismal Preparation Class, held the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Oscar Romero room, D Hall. *Pre-registration for this class required.* Call the church office to register. Baptism should be conferred in the first few weeks after the birth of a child. Godparents must be practicing Catholics.

**THE SACRAMENT OF FIRST CONFESSION AND FIRST HOLY COMMUNION** - Second grade is the normal time. One year prior Religious Education is required.

**THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS** - Men should call the parish priest or the Diocesan Vocation Director to help them discern their call to the Diaconate or Priesthood.

**THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** - Couples should make an appointment with the priest or deacon at the time of engagement and at least six months in advance of any wedding date to begin preparations. No date should be set before that meeting so all canonical requirements are met. One party must be registered and an active Catholic. All weddings take place inside the Church.

**THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF SICK** - The anointing of the sick can be administered to anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness. Please call the church office to make arrangements to be anointed. In an emergency, please use ext. 1, leave a message with your name and phone number. You will be contacted as soon as possible.

**HOLY COMMUNION AT HOME** - Please call the Church office to make arrangements.

## St. Barnabas Youth

### Youth: The Future or Part of the Present?

I often hear that the youth are the future of our Church. While this is true in a limited sense, I think what young people need to hear more frequently is that they are part of the Church in the present: they are valued and needed now and not just at some future date. Catholic youth today have many ideas and are contagiously enthusiastic about them. If we come to know them personally, they can shake us out of our normalcy and inspire us to act. Older adults have the wisdom and experience needed to help guide and encourage the youth in their enthusiasm, without which it is so easy for them to be discouraged and even give up. Please pray for the youth, and start forming relationships with them. It may not be as hard as you think once you start. They are in the same social hall after Mass as you are...

### What specifically are the youth learning about in Youth Ministry?

The middle school youth are in the middle of a special eight-week course, learning the Theology of the Body which explores the dignity of the human person and how we make God present to each other through our bodies. The high school youth are exploring the Scriptures, through a mixture of study and Lectio Divina (Christian meditation on the Scriptures).

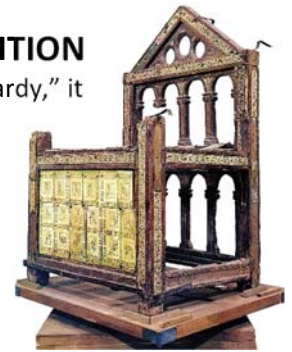

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In brushing up for "Catholic Jeopardy," it might help to know that there is only one feast on the calendar for a thing, rather than a person or mystery. It's for a chair: Saint Peter's chair in fact.



After the Resurrection, there can be no doubt that the disciples reserved a special place for Simon Peter in the upper room. Later, Peter became the bishop of Antioch in today's Syria, the place where we were first called "Christians." From there, he went to Rome, the center of the Empire, where it is said that Peter sat in a chair in the house of Priscilla and Aquila to instruct his flock. Jesus, in entrusting the keys of the Kingdom to Peter and his successors, entrusted his compassion and mercy to them, and charged them with pointing to the Kingdom of God. Compassion and mercy are to resonate through their teaching.

Since the ancient sign of a teacher is the chair ("disciple" literally means one who sits at the feet of a teacher), Peter's chair has long been treasured. Today there is a symbolic shrine of Peter's chair above the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This monument is the last work of Bernini, a huge bronze throne supported by four doctors of the Church: Augustine and Ambrose from the Western Church, and Chrysostom and Athanasius from the East. High above it is the alabaster window of the descent of the Holy Spirit.
